WHO ENTERED SUBSTANCE ABUSE FELONY PUNISHMENT FACILITIES?

SELECT DATA FOR FISCAL YEAR 2011 ADMISSIONS AN ISSUE BRIEF FROM LEGISLATIVE BUDGET BOARD STAFF

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OBJECTIVE

The Texas Department of Criminal Justice's (TDCJ) statutory mission is to provide public safety, promote positive change in offender behavior, reintegrate offenders into society, and assist victims of crime. TDCJ is organized into multiple divisions and organizational units. Five of the agency's divisions carry out its major responsibilities regarding offenders: the Community Justice Assistance Division. Correctional the Institutions Division. the Rehabilitation Programs Division, the Reentry and Integration Division, and the Parole Division.

KEY FACTS

- ◆ 58.3 percent of Substance Abuse Felony Punishment Facility (SAFPF) participants were admitted as a modification of community supervision.
- ♦ 48.2 percent of SAFPF program participants were admitted for a drug or alcohol related offense.

STATUTORY REFERENCES

Texas Government Code, Chapter 491

The data highlight offense and sentence characteristics of offenders admitted to substance abuse felony punishment facilities during fiscal year 2011. A Substance Abuse Felony Punishment Facility (SAFPF) is a facility that provides an intensive therapeutic community program for offenders who are sentenced by a judge as a condition of community supervision or as a modification of parole supervision. The data do not include characteristics of prison offenders, state jail offenders, or parole violators in Intermediate Sanction facilities. The data were extracted from individual-level records submitted by TDCJ Executive Services and may differ from the TDCJ Statistical Report due to methodological differences.

SENTENCE LENGTH

A SAFPF is a program with a set length of stay. Offenders with regular needs sentenced by a judge as a condition of community supervision participate in the six-month program. Offenders with special needs sentenced by a judge as a condition of community supervision participate in the nine-month program. Offenders placed in the program as a modification of parole or community supervision may participate in a shorter program.
