

2018-2019 General Appropriations Act




- (31.6%) Information Resources


Fiscal Years 2018-2019 By Objects of Expense









Compared to All Funds for Strategy A.1.3 Enforcement






Compared tp FTE for Strategy A.1.3 Enforcement



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
Enforcement Performance: Resolutions

TEC Resolution of Sworn Complaints Fiscal Years 2011 to 3/15/2018



- (40.1%) Number of sworn complaints dismissed for noncompliance with statutory form requirements
- (9.2%) Number of sworn complaints dismissed for lack of jurisdiction
- (5.7%) Number of sworn complaints dismissed after a finding of a lack of sufficient evidence to determine whether a violation within the jurisdiction of the commission has occurred
- (1.4%) Number of sworn complaints resolved by the commission through a Final Order
- (0.5%) Number of sworn complaints dismissed after a finding of no credible evidence of a violation



TEC Statutory Changes

Government Code Section 571.073 requires TEC to submit suggestions on how to improve statute relating to the agency's function. These reports are submitted every two years to the Office of the Governor and to the Legislature. **The following are previously submitted suggestions relating to sworn complaints that have not yet been enacted:**

2014 Recommendation No. 4: Groundless Sworn Complaints

Section 571.176 of the Government Code defines a frivolous complaint as a complaint that is groundless and brought in bad faith or is groundless and brought for the purpose of harassment. Modify the definition of a frivolous complaint by redefining the term "groundless complaint" to mean a complaint that does not allege a violation of law that is material, non-technical, or non-clerical on its face. In the alternative, remove the term "groundless" from the definition of a frivolous complaint, which would render a complaint frivolous if it is brought either in bad faith or for the purpose of harassment.

2016 Recommendation No. 10: Confidentiality of Sworn Complaints

Amend Section 571.140 of the Government Code to clearly allow a respondent or a respondent's counsel to waive confidentiality regarding a sworn complaint filed against the respondent. This would clearly allow a respondent or respondent's counsel to publicly discuss the sworn complaint, including the substance and allegations made in the complaint and the processing and resolution of the complaint.
