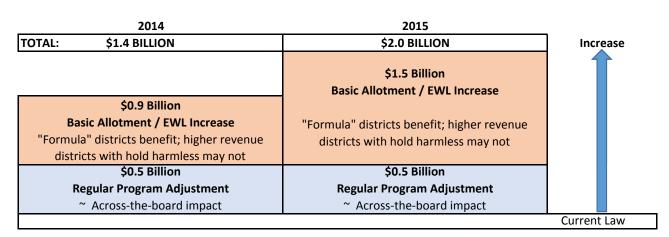
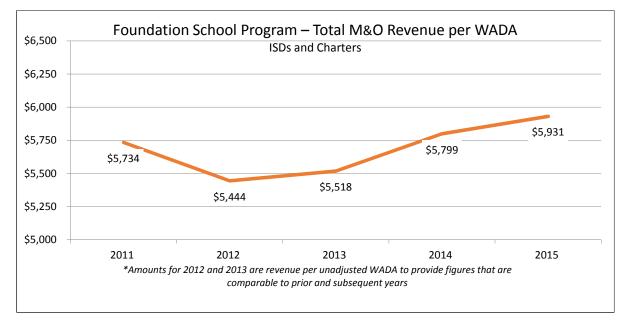

2014-15 FSP Increases above Current Law (at the time)





In FY2015:

- · On a statewide average, M&O revenue per WADA was higher than in FY2011
- · 682 Districts (67%) have M&O revenue level to or higher than FY2011
 - -- Generally, these are lower wealth districts that don't receive hold harmless
- · 342 Districts (33%) have M&O revenue below FY2011
 - -- Generally, these are higher wealth districts that receive hold harmless

2016-17 FSP Increases over 2014-15 within Current Law

- Continue 2015 Basic Allotment / EWL of \$5,040 and \$504,000
- Significant increase in Golden Penny yield
