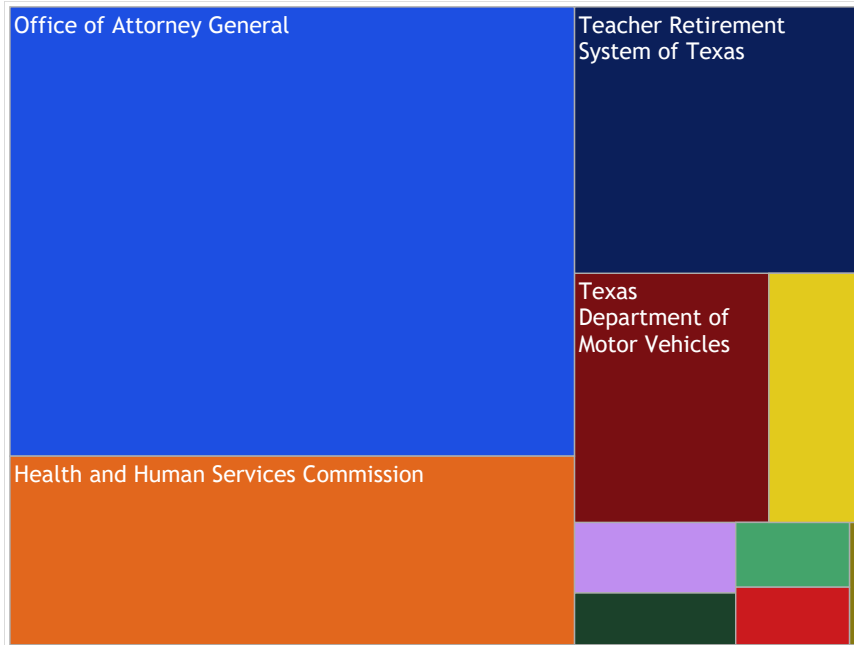


STATEWIDE PROJECTS BY AGENCY AND CURRENT ALL FUNDS COST

WHAT IS ON THIS SITE AND WHY WAS IT LAUNCHED?

The Quality Assurance Team (QAT) Dashboard was launched in October 2018, to provide state leadership, state agencies, and the public with the ability to view details of State of Texas agency major information resources projects (MIRPs) online and to track their progress over time.

The QAT Dashboard displays data received from agency reports. QAT oversees the state's technology project portfolio, which is a single view of all agency major information resources projects.

The QAT Dashboard is required because of legislation passed by the 85th Texas Legislature. The dashboard shines light onto the performance and spending of major information resources projects across Texas Government.

WHAT DATA IS DISPLAYED AND WHAT PROJECTS ARE INCLUDED?

The QAT Dashboard displays a subset of data from agency project monitoring reports, and displays performance indicators for the areas of budget, schedule, scope, and quality reported from state agencies for each major information resources project. Depending on the risk level of the project, data is either entered quarterly or monthly.

A major IR project is defined in Texas Government Code 2054.003 (10) as:

(A) any information resources technology project identified in a state agency's biennial operating plan whose development costs exceed \$1 million and that:

- (i) requires one year or longer to reach operations status;
- (ii) involves more than one state agency; or
- (iii) substantially alters work methods of state agency personnel or the delivery of services to clients; and

(B) any information resources technology project designated by the legislature in the General Appropriations Act as a major information resources project.
