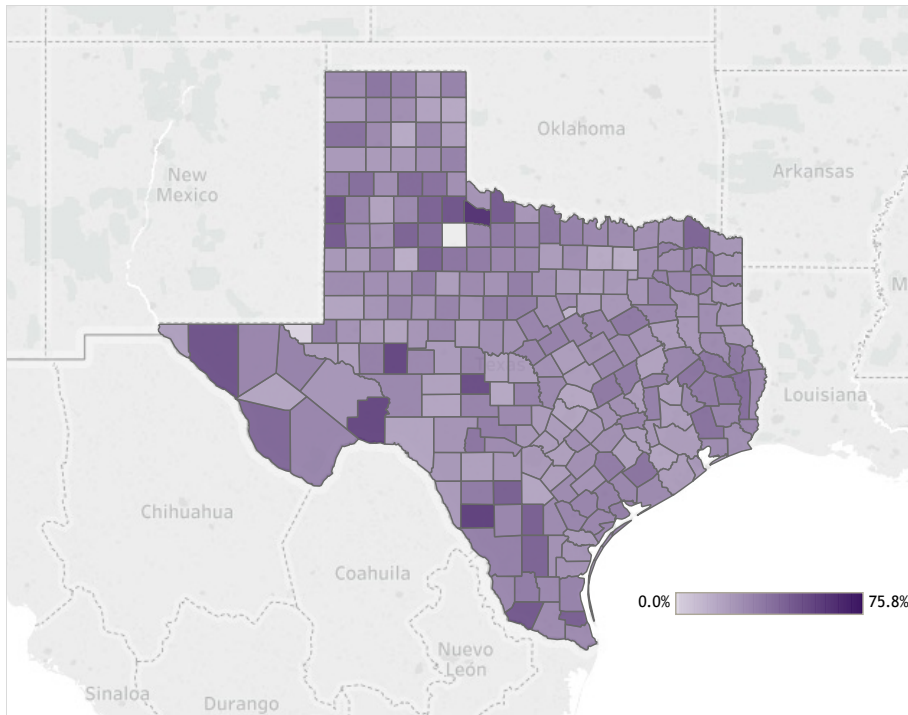

**Overview**

According to the 2012-2016 American Community Survey, there were 895,966 veterans statewide (Ages 18 to 64). According to the U.S. Census Bureau, Texas' veterans have a similar disability rate (28.1% to 28.3%) and a lower poverty rate (6.7% to 7.1%) compared to the national average. The following interactive map and table allow comparison of disability and poverty rates by Texas counties, and also for comparison of the veteran population to the non-veteran population. Users are able to compare data by county for four time periods collected by the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey.
